Preamble

These Conditions of Contest (SCoC) are supplemental to the General Conditions of Contest (GCoC) as issued by the World Bridge Federation and together form the set of Rules and Regulations governing the 2023 World Youth Bridge Teams Championships (hereinafter the "WYBTC").

These events are to be played a NH Eindhoven Conference Centre Koningshof in Veldhoven, the Netherlands, from 31st July to 7th August 2023. The Opening Ceremony will take place on 30th July, and the Closing and Prizegiving Ceremony on 7th August.

The following Ancillary Regulations will apply unless modified by this document.

Each of the above Ancillary Regulations will have the date of revision shown under the heading. Please ensure that when referring to them you check for an updated version on the website.

1. Definitions

Expressions used in these SCoC and not defined shall have their ordinary meaning in duplicate bridge terminology (which may include expressions defined in the Laws of Duplicate Bridge 2017). In the event of any doubt or dispute as to such meaning, the decision of the Championship Committee shall be final and conclusive. The singular shall include the plural and vice-versa; reference to one gender shall include the other.

Unless repugnant to the context or obvious meaning, all terms defined in the GCoC shall have the same meaning for these SCoC and, in addition, the following expressions when used in these SCoC shall have the following meanings:

1.1 NPC

means the non-playing captain of any team. Teams are not obliged to have non-playing captains: a team member may act as a playing captain if this is preferred. Non-playing captains are considered members of the team and will receive any medals awarded.

1.2 Coach

teams may elect to have a Coach or other official(s) attending the WYBTC.

1.3 Zone

means any of the eight geographical areas so defined by the WBF Statutes.

2. Conditions of Entry

All players must comply, in addition to any other eligibility regulations as detailed in the GCoC, with the following age restrictions, listed by Category:

- Under 31: for players born on or after 1st January 1993
- Under 26 Open/Women: for players born on or after 1st January 1998
- Under 21: for players born on or after 1st January 2003
- Under 16: for players born on or after 1st January 2008

However, exceptionally for these 2023 WYBTC, for a **maximum of two players in each team,** the following ages will be permitted:

- Under 31: for players born on or after 1st January 1992
- Under 26 Open/Women: for players born on or after 1st January 1997
- Under 21: for players born on or after 1st January 2002
- Under 16: for players born on or after 1st January 2007

2.1 U31 Eligibility

For the purposes of National representation as stated in the <u>WBF Eligibility Code</u> the U31 Category does not count as a Youth event, and the exemption in Article 6 of the Code does not apply.

2.2 General

Each NBO, duly qualified from its Zone, shall be entitled to nominate one team in each of the Categories for which it has qualified. Registrations must be submitted electronically via the <u>designated WBF website</u> no later than 1st June 2023. Such registration serves as a commitment by the NBO to participate in the respective Category.

The names of players and any NPC of each team, submitted in accordance with the conditions of entry established in Section of the General Conditions of Contest, must be registered via the designated website not later than 30th June 2023.

2.3 Entry Fees

The prescribed entry fees for the main Championship events, namely €1,000 per team for the U31, U26 Open/Women and U21 Categories (no entry fee for the U16), must be paid by bank transfer in Euros to:

stating as reference the name of the NBO and the Category entered. Payment must be received by the WBF no later than 30th June 2023.

In the **Transnational Board-a-Match** ("TBAM") event, new players and whole new teams may enter. Players from the main championships, and new U16 players, play free of charge. The entry fees for other new players are €50 per player, with a maximum of €200 per team. They must be paid in cash on-site prior to the start of the event.

2.4 Team Members

In addition to a non-playing captain, each team may have four, five or six members. If an NBO wishes to replace a team member or members, or if fewer than six players were submitted for invitation, such replacement or increase must be from the NBO submitting the team and may be added prior to the start of the first session of play with the permission of the Credentials Committee present at the site.

However, following such approval by the Credentials Committee, the Championship Committee reserves the right to place any restrictions on that team it deems proper.

2.5 Penalty for Non-Participation

If a previously entered team in these Championships determines it is unable to participate, the WBF shall be notified at least 48 hours before the scheduled Captains' meeting for these Championships. Except in cases of force majeure, the entry fee will be refunded only if the NBO notifies the WBF at least two weeks before the start of the Championship that its team or teams will not participate.

3. Right to Enter

The number of teams from each Zone invited to participate in the 2023 WYBTC are:

Zone 1: 8 teams;Zone 4: 1 team;Zone 7: 2 teams;Zone 2: 3 teams;Zone 5: 1 team;Zone 8: 2 teams.

Zone 3: 2 teams; **Zone 6**: 4 teams;

The host country (the Netherlands) has the right to enter a team in addition to its Zone's quota, unless already qualified within the quota, in which case its Zone (Zone 1) gets a further berth.

Each participating member NBO must play against all other participating member NBOs. Entry and subsequent refusal to play will result in disqualification.

4. Format for the WYBTC

The format will consist of a **five-day Round Robin** ("RR") qualification followed by a Knockout ("KO") stage consisting of **one day each of Quarter-finals, Semi-finals and Final**.

The schedule of play will be published as soon as it is available.

4.1 Quarter-finals

At the end of the Round Robin, the eight highest-ranked teams in each Category qualify for the quarter-finals. They are played on 5th August as knockout matches in four 14-board sessions except for the U16 Category, which will play three 14-board sessions, with match-ups determined as follows:

The qualifiers ranked 1-2 after the RR, in that order, freely choose their opponents among the fifth to eighth-ranked qualifiers. Those chosen teams get ranked 8-7, respectively. The remaining teams are reranked 3-6 in accordance with their ranking in the RR, and no. 3 opposes no. 6, and no. 4 opposes no. 5.

Teams eliminated at this stage may enter the second day of TBAM, free of charge.

4.2 Semi-finals

The semi-finals are played on 6th August as knockout matches in four 14-board sessions except for the U16 Category, which will play three 14-board sessions.

The match-ups are determined as follows, subject to the requirement that two teams from the same country shall meet in the semi-finals: The no. 1 ranked team, immediately upon the conclusion of the process in Section 4.1 above, chooses among the other three quarter-finals matches which will become the semi-final opponent of the winner of its own quarter-final match.

4.3 Final and Play-Off

The final and play-off for third place are played on 7th August as knockout matches of four 14-board sessions except for the U16 Category, which will play three 14-board sessions.

If one team resigns the right to play off for third place, it will automatically be placed in fourth place, their opponents being declared bronze medalists. The resigning team will be awarded one-third of the Master

Points for fourth place.

If both teams decide, by mutual agreement, not to play off for third place, there will be no bronze medal awarded, and both teams will be placed fourth, being awarded one-third of the Master Points for fourth place.

The defeated quarter-finalists will be ranked 5th to 8th according to the VP total in the round-robin; if a tie exists, it will be broken using the normal tie-break criteria.

5. Format for the TBAM

This event is played on 5th – 7th August.

The format will be announced as soon as the final number of participants is known but is likely to consist of two days of qualifying followed by one day of finals A and B.

6. Carry Over

There will be no carry over in any matches of the knockout phase.

7. Tie-breaks

Ties will be broken in accordance with the Tie Breaking Procedures.

8. The Schedule of Play

The schedule of play will be published on the Championship Website

9. Conversion Scales

The difference in IMPs earned by the two opposing teams at the end of the matches scored in IMPs shall be converted to Victory Points, according to the official WBF conversion scales.

10. Scoring and Bidding at the Table

Electronic or Digital devices will be used for the official scoring throughout the Championship.

Tablets will be used for bidding and entering results. Each table will have four tablets, one for each player. Each player uses the tablet for bidding and scoring the result.

11. Score Corrections

11.1 Correction Period

The Correction Period normally expires thirty minutes after the posting of scores at the end of play on each day or, for the final session of a day that is not the final day of the event, until the start of play the following day.

Upon a proposal of the Head Director or the Operations Director, the Tournament Committee may modify the Correction Periods prior to any event. Any changes will be posted prominently in the playing area and listed on the event's website.

11.2 Corrections

Requests to correct manifestly incorrect scores (e.g. four spades scored as played by West, but in fact played by North) entered at any time during a stage of an event may be requested until 30 minutes after the end of that stage.

Otherwise, a request to change a score that was agreed upon at the table may be submitted only until the end of the Correction Period, and the score will be changed only once it is proven erroneous to the complete satisfaction of the Head Tournament Director.

However, no correction may be requested more than 30 minutes after the scores are posted for the final session of a qualification stage. This includes KOs, where every round is a qualification stage.

12. Line-ups

The line-ups must be submitted electronically in accordance with the details below. Failure of a captain to submit his line-up in a timely fashion will result in penalties being applied in accordance with the Procedures for Apportioning Penalties.

The line-ups during the round-robin for both teams must be submitted no later than 10 minutes after the end of the previous round; teams will not know the line-up of their opponents. The line-up for the first round must be given in accordance with the decision taken in the Captains' Meeting.

In the K.O. phase, the team to line-up first must submit its line-up no later than 10 minutes after the end of the previous session. The other team must submit its line-up no later than 15 minutes after the end of the previous session or no later than 5 minutes after the submission of the first line-up, whichever is later.

Line-ups are to be submitted in a manner communicated at the Captains' Meeting. There will be a dedicated area in the playing venue, with computers, for this purpose. However, each team will have its own password protected dedicated page in the wireless LAN set by the organisation. Therefore, team captains with their own computers or mobile devices can submit their line-ups electronically from any location.

The time of the line-up will be recorded automatically by the system, and penalties for late line-ups will be applied. An official clock will be set in the playing area to show the official time.

If a partnership that has not registered a specific System Card is to play, they should indicate on the lineup form which of the registered System Cards will be used.

13. Designation of Matches and Seeding

13.1 Seeding

After seeding each Series the draws will be randomised, with the only restriction being that minor changes can be made in the designations in order to ensure that teams of the same Country meet in the early rounds.

13.2 Responsibility for the Draw

The draw will be made under the direction of the Championship Committee. The team numbers and the sequence of the matches will be published on the WBF Website. The Championship Committee has the authority to make some changes in the numbers of the teams (and as a consequence in the sequence of play) if required by occurrences after the draw has been announced.

14. Seating Rights

See WBF Regulations Governing Seating Rights

15. Change of Players

A change of players or partnerships, if approved by the Operations Director or the Head TD, can be made only at the beginning of a match or a session (but see exception in any tie-breaking regulations that may



apply).

16. Disclosure of Systems and Conventions

These Championships are Category 3 events in accordance with the WBF Systems Policy and neither Brown Sticker conventions nor HUM systems are permitted at any time.

16.1 Supplementary Sheets

While the use of Supplementary Sheets is encouraged to clarify the information given on the WBF System Card, there may be at most six supplementary sheets per system.

16.2 Submission of systems

Systems must be registered in accordance with the <u>WBF Systems Policy</u> and the Regulations for Registration and Use of Systems no later than 30th June 2023.

17. Psyching of Conventional or Artificial Opening Bids

The psyching of conventional or artificial opening bids is prohibited.

18. Disqualification or Withdrawal of a Team

See procedures for Walkovers and Forfeits.
