Merrimac Coup in Salsomaggiore

Just a week ago, the seventh Open Youth Transnational World Championship was played in Salsomaggiore Terme, Italy.

This was the antepenultimate board, played in the Individual tournament which ended the championships. As it was far too late to make it into the final bulletin, we put it into the first bulletin here.

The main characters (I am sorry to see that the WBF website does not provide full play records – so I cannot find out who the fourth player was) were:

- East and declarer: Richard Gabriel of Slovakia.

- South and opening leader: Luca Crone of Ireland
- North and the main actor on this board: Sibrand Van Oosten of the Netherlands.

Sibrand had won, earlier in the week, gold in the under-26 Open Pairs, and silver in the Open teams. This, together with his 25th place in the Individual, would earn him the bronze medal in the Junior Triathlon. He would also, later that evening, be crowned as one of the Joan Gerard Youth Award winners. Maybe he will win something for his actions on this deal.

Despite his light opening, Richard Gabriel felt he wanted to show his spade stopper, so he bid 2NT. West felt that the six-card suit might provide the extra trick needed to make the game contract. Sibrand van Oosten told me afterwards that he felt the contract would fail, and if doubling asked for a diamond lead, that would certainly not hurt. Luca Crone stated that he did interpret the double as asking the lead of dummy's suit, and he led the ♦8.

Declarer asked for a small diamond and Sibrand took his queen and immediately returned his king of hearts. Now, his ♦10 stopped the run of the diamonds, and dummy could no longer be reached to enjoy the small diamonds.

A genuine Merrimac Coup, named after the ship that was deliberately sunk in the harbor of Santiago de Cuba during the Spanish-American war of 1898, trying to bottle up the Spanish fleet.

Mobile phones and electronic devices



When team events are played, the Tournament Directors will conduct random searches before every round: players of the drawn tables will be asked to empty their pockets and open their bags. Whoever refuses to do it will be penalised as if a device had been found, and escorted out of the playing room. A substitute will be allowed.

Mobile phones and any other electronic device which can be used to communicate and to connect to the internet can be carried to the tables but must always be switched off and clearly visible. They cannot be carried from the room until the end of play for any reason, but in case of emergency seek the permission of an official.

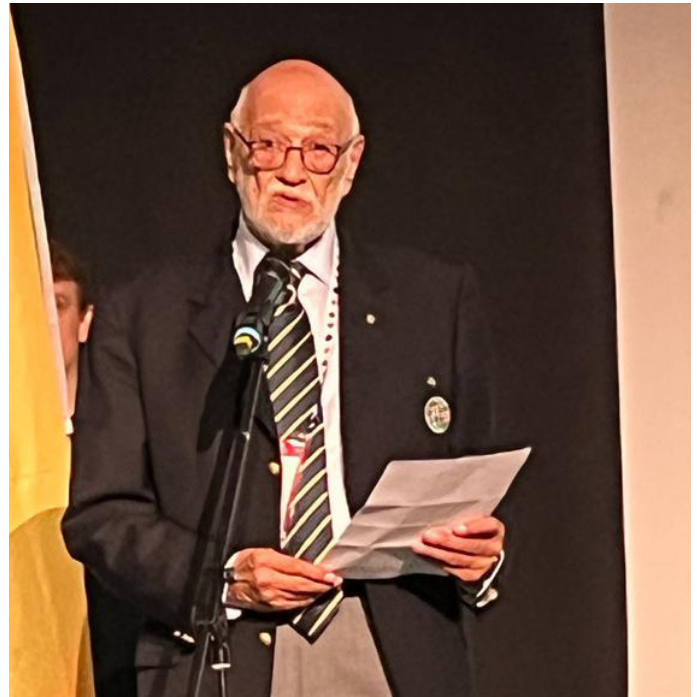
First of all, I want to thank the Polish Bridge Union, the City of Wroclaw and the Local Organising Committee for having given us the opportunity to hold our championship.

In a situation where you are a trick short of the required number, it can be a sound strategy to play off your long suit before committing yourself. Look at this deal from the match between Poland and Tunisia

from Round 1 of the Open teams.

In the other room Jassem and Mazurkiewicz had stopped in 4♠, so there was plenty riding on the result.

South led the eight of diamonds (would you have found a heart lead?) and declarer won in hand with the ace and drew trumps. With time in hand, he continued with four more rounds of spades, South pitching the ♦5, ♦2, ♦6 and ♦9 while North parted with the ♦7, ♦3, ♣3 and ♦J. When declarer cashed the ♦K, everyone threw a heart to leave this position:

When declarer cashed the last spade, South had to part with a heart – pitching a club would allow declarer to play ace and another club. Reading the position perfectly, declarer discarded dummy's queen of hearts, played a heart to the ace and a club, covering North's six with the eight to force South to lead into the ♣AQ.

The legendary Jean-Paul Meyer reported this deal:

In the other room India had played 3NT for 430 so Rombaut had to make 4♥ to avoid a heavy loss. The defenders accurately led ace and another spade, but Satya made a subtle error when he played a low spade to trick two (a high spade for a diamond shift would have sunk declarer).

When Nadar shifted to a club, Rombaut made his first nice play by ducking.

Satya won his ace, and back came a third spade, ruffed high. Declarer drew two rounds of trump, finding East to be 6-3 in the majors. Now came ♦A in case the ♦K was singleton, ♠Q to pitch a diamond and declarer's last trump.

With an inferential count of the full deal (East had to have two clubs or he would have unblocked ♣A at trick two, and the ♦K for his opening bid) the last trump was sure to ruin West. When he pitched

a diamond Rombaut ruffed a diamond and his hand was high but had West pitched a club the clubs would have set up.

Hold the Front Page

For no reason I logged onto BBO at the end of Round 11 in the Open, but there was only one table still in play, the Closed Room in Germany v Italy. As you will see I had certainly picked the right moment!

Women Teams – McConnell Cup

The ten teams will play a qualification over three days, from August 20th to August 22nd, a full Round Robin of three sixteen board matches a day. At the end, the top four teams qualify to the semifinals. The first classified team will chose its opponents between the third and fourth, while the remaining two teams will be paired automatically.

The semifinals will be played over four stanzas of 14 boards each, in one day, on August 23rd.

The Final will be contested over two days, on August 24th and 25th, three stanzas of fourteen boards per day.

Ties will be resolved in favour of the team that won the head-to-head match (if any) in the qualification stage or, otherwise, the higher-ranked team in the qualification stage.

queen. Declarer ruffed, cashed the ace of clubs, played a diamond to the ace and played a heart, overruffing East's jack for eleven tricks, +150.

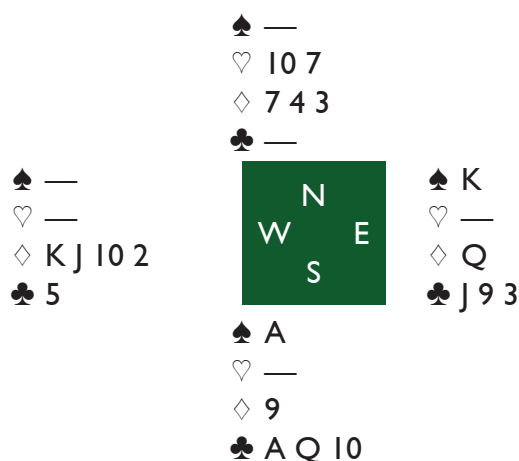
Neither the declarer play nor the defence was perfect (declarer should have ruffed the six of hearts and by the same token West should have switched to a diamond) but in 3♣ it hardly mattered.

West led the king of hearts and declarer ruffed, played a diamond to the ace, and the jack of spades. When East failed to cover declarer was in with a shout. He crossruffed hearts and spades to reach this position:



Declarer cashed the ace of clubs, then the ace of spades and exited with a diamond, not caring who won. +1540 and a spectacular 16 IMPs.

However, because of misinformation the result of the deal was cancelled at this table.

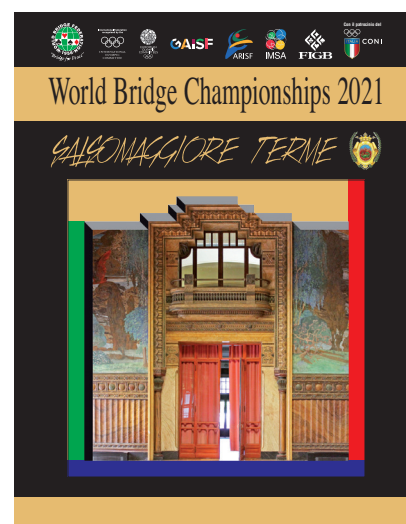
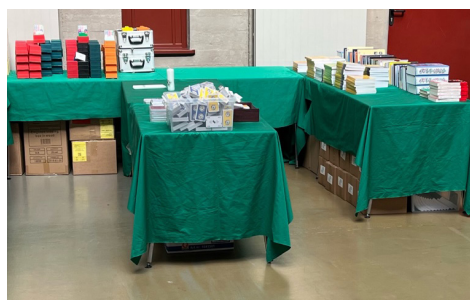

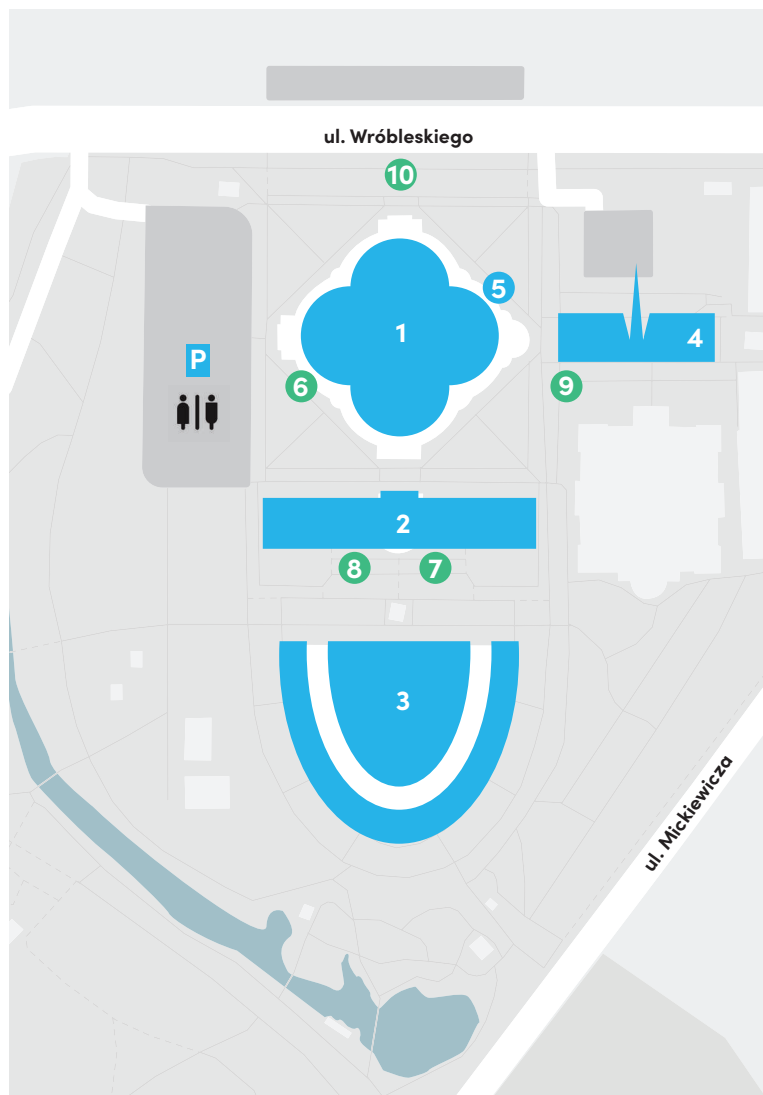
The book is distributed by Master Point Press and will be available from bridge suppliers around the world. The e-book is available on the MPP website, for US\$25.
