North led the ♥7 to dummy's ♥A and declarer played a diamond to the queen. North won, returned the ♥8 for South to ruff, won the spade switch with the ♠J, gave partner another heart ruff and won the next trick with the ♠A, one down, -100 and 64.45-23.55.

If declarer had cashed the ♣A he would have collected 10 tricks, +130 being worth 57.30-30.70 for EW.

East might have bid 3NT over 3♦. Give partner as little as ♦K987642 and you may have a play for nine tricks. It was easy enough to collect 10 tricks in diamonds, +130 scoring only 2.07-85.93.

3NT making on the nose would have been worth 67.52-20.48 and some pairs made overtricks that added to their score.

On Board 22 the contract was 1NT. What would David Bird do? Right you are if your reply is nothing.

North led the ♠2 and when declarer played dummy's ♠5 South won with the ♠K and returned the ♠3 to dummy's ♠A. Declarer forced out the ♦A, won the spade return with the ♠Q and played a club, ensuring nine tricks, +600.

Did you spot the winning defence?

South must switch to the ♥K at trick two. If declarer ducks you go back to spades and if declarer wins the ♥A you take the ♦A and play a low heart, establishing enough defensive tricks.



Do you see declarer's countermeasure?

Playing the ♠A at trick one is a killing blow. Now when South switches to the ♥K after taking the ♦A declarer wins and plays a club establishing a ninth trick.

Those who made 3NT collected 68.55-19.45. Going one down was worth only 2.12-49.88 but that was in the U26 event. One unfortunate soul played in 1NTxx as South, and -2200 was a mere 0.02-87.89.

East led the ♥A and switched to the ♠K, declarer winning and playing the ♦Q, covered an ruffed, followed by the ♥K, pitching the ♣10 when West ruffed with the ♠10. West exited with the ♠6 and having taken the ♠Q East switched to the ♦7, declarer discarding dummy's ♣2. West could win the ♦K but declarer had the rest, -50, only 18.43-69.57 for NS.

I wonder why South didn't double 4♥. That happened a few times, the best result being -1100 for 83.89-4.11.

West's double turned out well, but only because North was tempted to support hearts.

Declarer took the lead of the ♣6 with dummy's ♣A and played a heart for the queen and king, West switching to the ♦Q for the king and ace. East cashed the ♣K and continued with the ♣Q, declarer discarding the ♦10. When declarer discarded a spade on the next club he could not avoid three down, -500 and 0.02-87.98 for NS.

South led the ♥8 and having won with the ♥K declarer cashed five clubs. South came down to ♠3 ♥AQ92 ♦J6 and declarer cashed dummy's ♠K and ran the ♠J, securing a useful overtrick, +430 being worth 51.16-36.84.



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Follow the Leader

I decided to follow the fortunes of the mercurial Danish pair Christian Lahrman and Nikolaj Hammelev in the opening round of the U26 Final. It was a Howell movement so they played in both directions.

You should not make 5♦ on the NS cards. If East leads a top club declarer ruffs and plays a diamond to dummy, West winning and switching to a heart. Two pairs bid 5♦, both going down, one of them doubled, scoring 8.00-16.00 and 2.00-22.00.



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Hammelev and Lahrman got to play in 3♥ and South led the ♦7. If declarer plays a heart to the queen and ace at trick two South needs to switch to a club. 3♥ made on the nose for +140 and 19.00-5.00 for EW.

Our featured pair were playing 2NT from North, East leading the ♥5. If declarer wins, crosses to dummy with a spade and plays a club to the ten East does best to duck, but I suspect that did not happen, as declarer emerged with no less than 11 tricks, +210 being worth 18.00-6.00.

Yuanzhe Niu and Zhongtian Wang tried 1NTx by West. North led the ♦7. (In some schools leading the beer card is not allowed!) The

defenders had no trouble securing seven tricks and +200 was 22.00-2.00.

If North happens to hit on a club lead two down becomes possible, South winning and returning a club.

The Danes doubled EW in 3♦, South leading the ♦3 (a trump is frequently a good idea against a doubled contract when your side holds the balance of power). If North wins with the ♦A and switches to a club the defenders should collect 300, but South must be alert and hop up with the ♥K if declarer plays a low heart towards the ♥Q. They achieved one down and -100 and that was worth only 6.00-18.00.

The NS pairs who played in spades usually took nine tricks, +140 collecting 19.00-5.00.

Lahrman led the ♦6 and declarer could not find a way to more than nine tricks, +600 scoring only 5.00-19.00.

The lack of entries to dummy is apparent, but if declarer wins the opening lead with the ♦J and plays a spade to the ten (giving a 74.86% chance of three tricks) it will be possible to play the clubs for three tricks, securing a valuable overtrick worth 17.00-7.00.

One declarer even managed +660 for a rare 24.00-0.00.

The Danes were in 3♦ played by West and North led the ♣K. If the defenders fail to switch declarer can ruff the third round of the suit and play on trumps. Now switching to hearts will be too late as long as declarer

gets the spades right.
Most pairs played in 1NT with the EW cards, all going down, but 3♦ made for +110 gave the Danes a rare 24.00-0.00.

North was the declarer in 4♠, but East's heart lead gave declarer no chance and -100 was another complete top for the Danes, 24.00-0.00.

If South is the declarer and the defenders start with three rounds of clubs, declarer ruffs, cashes the ♠AQ and plays three rounds of diamonds, ruffing in dummy. Then

two rounds of spades leave East on lead with only hearts left and declarer scores the last three tricks with the ♥A♦J10 for +620 and 21.00-3.00.

At the end of the session Lahrman-Hammelev had achieved 68.17% to lead the way.

Christian Lahrman & Nikolaj Hammelev had scored poorly in the second session of the final, demonstrating the lottery that is pairs. Was it possible that in the remaining session they could mount a charge to the podium?

If declarer can divine the trump position, 6♣ can be made. That is more likely if East has overcalled. When it went down Lahrman & Hammelev scored 23.00-1.00.

With EW bidding up to 2♠ it was no unusual for NS to go on to 3♥. That is what Lahrman & Hammelev did and West doubled.

East led the ♥6, usually a sound idea in this situation, but declarer finished with 10 tricks! Probably West won with the ♥K and returned the ♥J, declarer winning with the queen and playing a diamond to the ace followed by the two for the ten and queen a third diamond. +630 scored a maximum, 24.00-0.00.

As long as NS bid and made 4♠ they were assured of the lion's share of the match points. The Danes did and scored 17.00-7.00.

On Board 5 EW held ♠A7 ♥7542 ♦Q103 ♣10963 opposite ♠KQ10854 ♥3 ♦A65 ♣AK2. South held ♠J63 ♥AJ86 ♦J87 ♣854 so you could make 4♠ with a good diamond guess, or 3NT. When To and Kung stopped in 3♠, +170 gave the Danes 18.00-6.00.

Several pairs bid 4♠ with the NS cards, and +450 was just over average, 13.00-11.00. However, Taking 11 tricks for +690 in 4♠x was worth 23.00-1.00 for Lahrmann & Hammelev. They suffered a set back on Board 7. Almost everyone played 4♠ with ♠72 ♥K982 ♦K86 ♣AKQ3 opposite ♠AKQ986 ♥- ♦Q974 ♠1074. South held ♠J104 ♥J1076 ♦J10 ♣J952 so



divining the diamond position delivered 12 tricks. Scoring only +650 was only 4.00-20.00

As you might expect there was a wide range of results, the danger for EW being that they might overstep the mark with a spade sacrifice. +420 in 4♥ was a dead average 12.00-12.00.

Over the next few deals there was little to set the pulse racing, and on checking the running scores I discovered that with six deals remaining the Danes were in fourth place, probably too far behind to worry the leaders, Baozhuo Jiang & Brian Zhang, but with an outside chance of catching Michail Soumplis & Iasonas Papaspyrou or Chongshang Huang & Yuantao Zheng.

As fate would have it they met the leaders on the next two deals:

12 pairs bid a game with the EW cards, nine in 3NT, two in 5♦ and one in 5♣, all going down to a greater or lesser degree (3NT-5 was a zero). The exception was the NS pair who were doubled in 4♥, -800 producing a zero in the opposite direction. Jiang and Zhang tried 3NT, South leading the ♥2. Declarer was down before he had started and took only 6 tricks, -150 and only 6.00–18.00 for the leaders.

Taking 11 tricks in 3NT as West on the lead of the ♦J for +460 and 20.00–4.00 kept Danish hopes alive, but in contrast to Wednesday's dramatic finale there was no Hans Christian Andersen like fairy tale ending as two modest results on the last two deals saw them fall short of their objective. For once, their Midas Touch had deserted them.



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Pairs Final U31, session 2

Prosperity and Achievement

Today is August 8. In China, 8 is generally considered the lucky number so 8-8 (=today) should mean a double quantity of luck. As we all know, a certain amount of luck is indispensable to achieve good results as a player in matchpoint events. Luck is also a useful asset for a bridge journalist; his/her luck would consist of being at the right table at the right moment. Looking back on what I saw here and there during this session, I cannot complain at all about my luck. Below, you will find out soon enough (I hope) why. I will concentrate this time on the U31 final.

Already on the second board of the session you would need quite a lot of good luck as E/W.

East opens 1NT (15-17) and what should West do? Usually, 8 hcp are not enough in West for any action but maybe, you decide to upgrade your two tens and produce a positive noise after all. Quite a number of pairs all over the playing area did so. Most of them ended up in 3NT and only a few in the ice-cold 4♥. For the latter, they enjoyed their stint of good luck here because 4♥ is unbeatable on the actual

layout: all suits breaking nicely and the ♦ J well placed. 3NT, however, is a different story. To succeed in making this, you would need a double portion of luck – only proper on August 8. Not only would you have to avoid a club lead, but you would also have to avoid a club switch after giving up a first trick in diamonds. To get to nine tricks, you would need to develop extra tricks in that suit, of course, so the defence would get an extra chance to attack clubs anyway. Most defenders led the safe enough (?) ♠ 10 rather than a club. When they persisted with spades after winning the ♦ K, declarer was home in his ambitious No-Trump game.

The next board required some luck but also good bidding and playing technique.

If the auction starts like this, not at all unlikely, what should South do? Partner is showing a strong hand so it may well be that an ace is just enough for South to

make a polite raise, even more so when it is your lucky day.

As the cards lie, 4♠ can always be made double dummy but against the best defence, the winning line is far from obvious. You win the heart lead in dummy and take a spade finesse. When the ♠Q wins, you try the ♣Q first, to create a possible further entry to dummy with the ♣J. If the ♣Q wins, you suddenly have a serious problem. Only if you continue ♣A and another, the defence has no resource: East can win his ♣K but has no good return/exit. If East ducks the ♣10 as well, West has to ruff from his possible trump trick. If East immediately takes the ♣K when declarer advances the ♣Q, the ♣J will become the entry needed for a second finesse in a pointed suit. In the U31, 4♠ was bid twice and made only once. Speaking about luck: one West returned a trump when declarer ducked the heart lead to him, thus conceding an overtrick...

A few boards later, no N/S pair tried to exploit their luck.

The popular contract was 3NT which should and most of the time did go down on a spade lead by East. Some Easts led some more passive card, making declarer feel lucky. But what about 6♣? With trumps 4-1, as they are, this should go down but 5♣ definitely is a good place to be, but was selected by nobody anywhere in the room.

Yes, I saw a slam bid somewhere but that was 6♦...

Two boards later, it definitely had to be your lucky day if you were in 4♠.
